2021 Midwifery Workforce Survey

The midwifery workforce survey information is collected from all midwives who apply for an annual midwifery practising certificate. The survey is completed by midwives during the online annual practising certificate application process.

The 2021 survey is for midwives who held a midwifery annual practising certificate on **21 May 2021**. At that date there were 3283 midwives with a current practising certificate. Most responses were collected in February and March 2021.

This report sets out the results of the survey questions, gives the responses in table and chart form.

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Key facts from the 2021 midwifery workforce survey

Survey responses for midwives with a current practising certificate on 21 May 2021 show the following key points:

- **Number:** There are 3283 midwives who held an annual practising certificate at the time of the survey.
- **Gender:** The midwifery workforce is almost completely female.
- **Age:** The average age of midwives in New Zealand was 47 years old.
- **Ethnicity:** The workforce is predominantly midwives who selected European as their first ethnicity, making up 82.27%. The percentage of midwives who give New Zealand Maori as their first ethnicity is 7.04% (231). The percentage of midwives who give New Zealand Maori as their first, second, or third ethnicity is 11.27% (370).
- **Time in workforce:** The average time in the midwifery workforce is 14.89 years.
- **Reason for returning to practice:** 202 midwives responded that they had returned to practice. Returning from parental leave was the most reported reason for returning.
- **Caseloading Midwives:** 39.20% of midwives (1287) reported caseloading as their main work situation. The majority of these were self-employed LMC midwives (1079). LMC midwives make up 83.84% of the caseloading midwives and 32.87 % of the midwifery workforce.
- **Core Midwives:** 47.82% of midwives (1570) reported core midwifery practice as their main work situation.
- **Multiple jobs:** 24.79% of midwives (814) reported a second job and 10.02% of midwives (328) reported a third job.
- **Employer type:** 54.86% of midwives (1801) reported a District Health Board (in various work situations) as their main employer.
- **Hours per week:** 44.23% of midwives (1452) reported working 32 hours or less in total per week.
- **First midwifery qualification:** The most common qualification for entry to the Register was a degree in Midwifery from an accredited New Zealand education institute (1776 midwives – 54.10%).
- **Currently studying:** 6.67% of midwives (219) reported that they were currently engaged in formal study.
- **Completed qualification last year:** 4.58% of midwives (150) reported that they had completed a formal qualification in the last year.
- **Nursing registration:** 19.01% of midwives (624) reported that they remained on a nursing register or roll. Of this, 283 midwives reported that they would also apply for a nursing annual practising certificate.

The 2021 Midwifery Workforce Survey differs from previous years in an attempt to streamline the process for midwives. The result is that this document does not contain some data that would normally be expected. The results of this have been analysed and applied to future iterations of the workforce survey.

The following data is not present in this document:

- **Reason not currently practising**
- **Caseload size**
- **Second and third District Health Board/Territorial Local Authorities**
- **Hours for third work type**

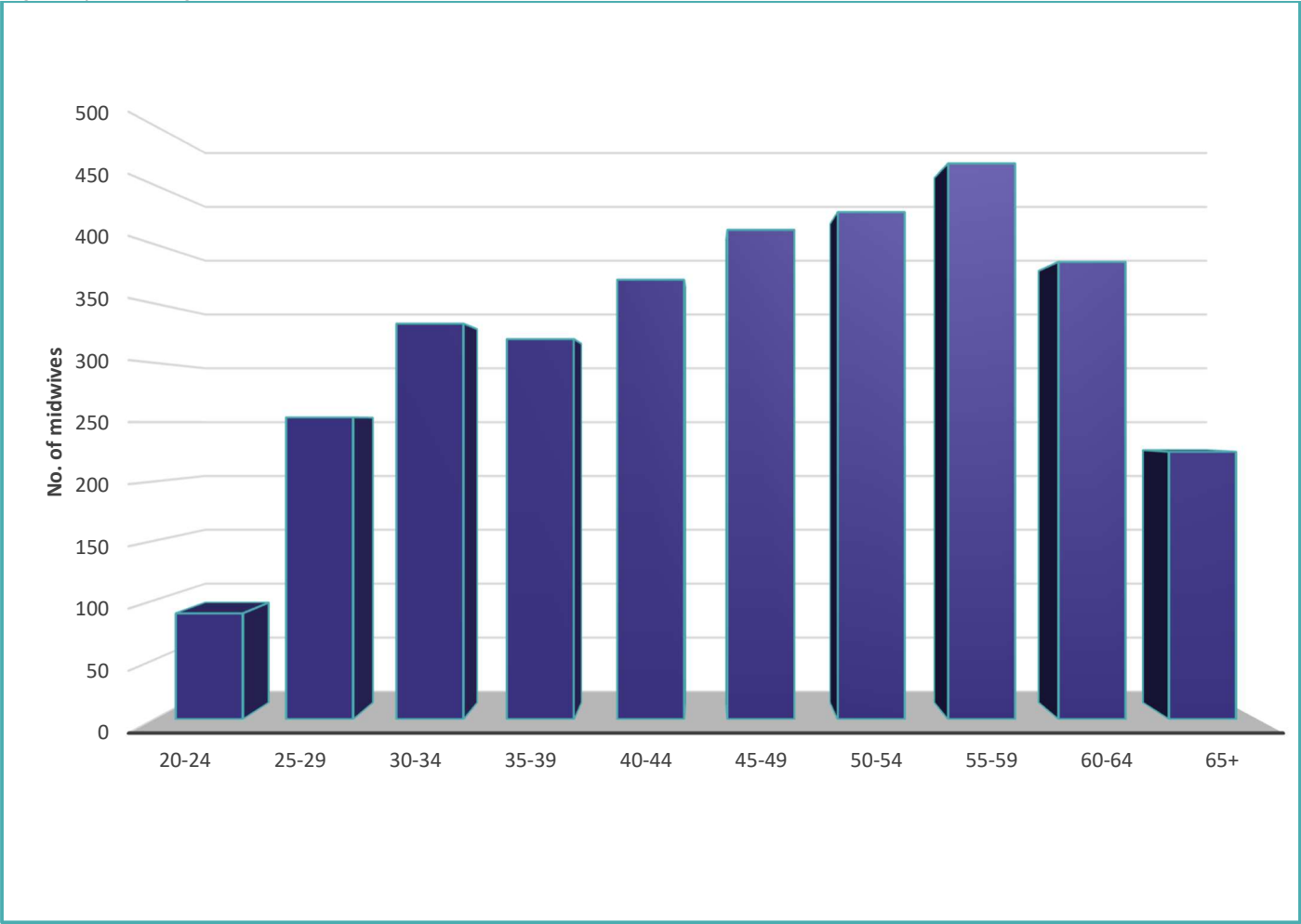

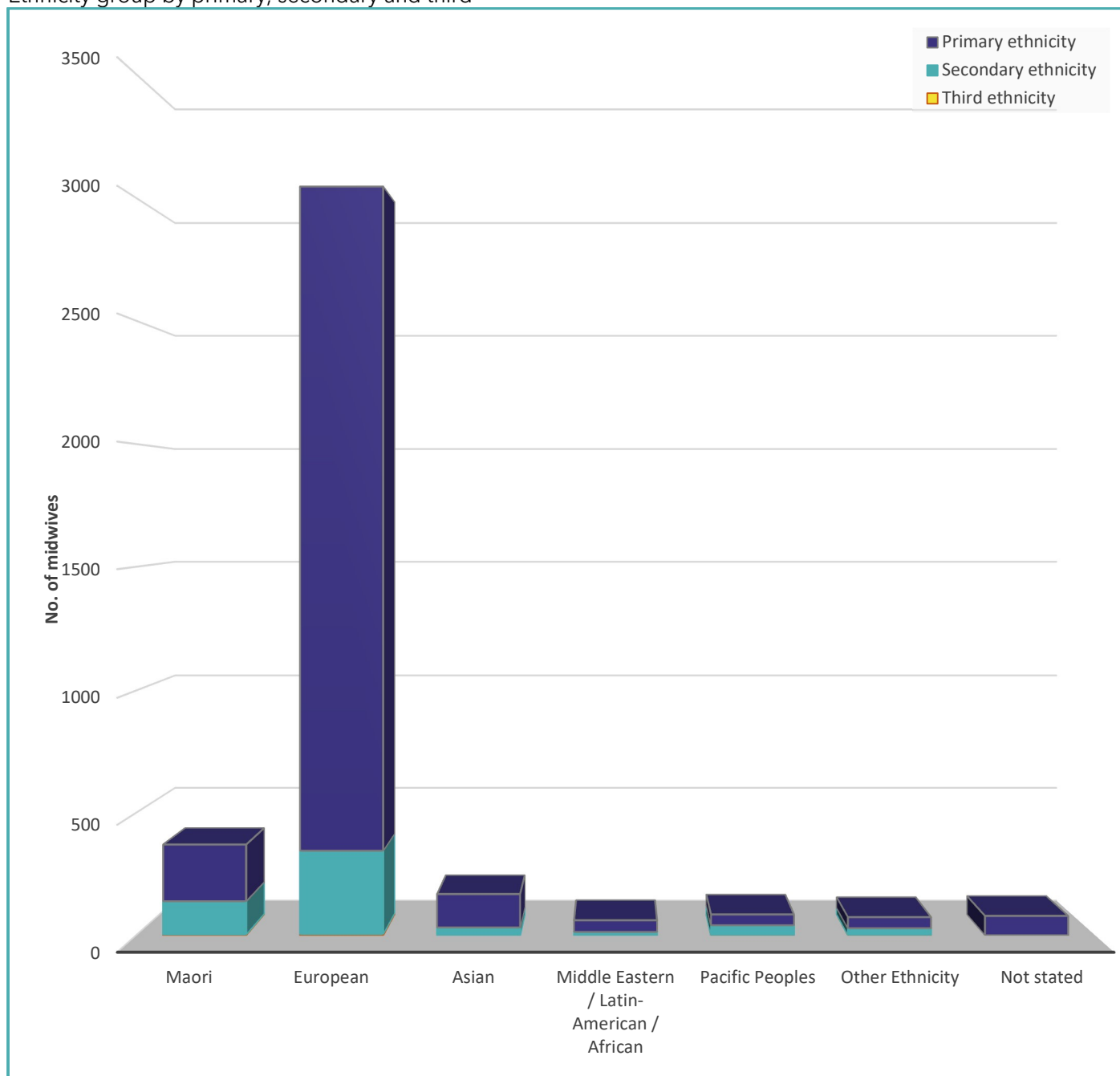

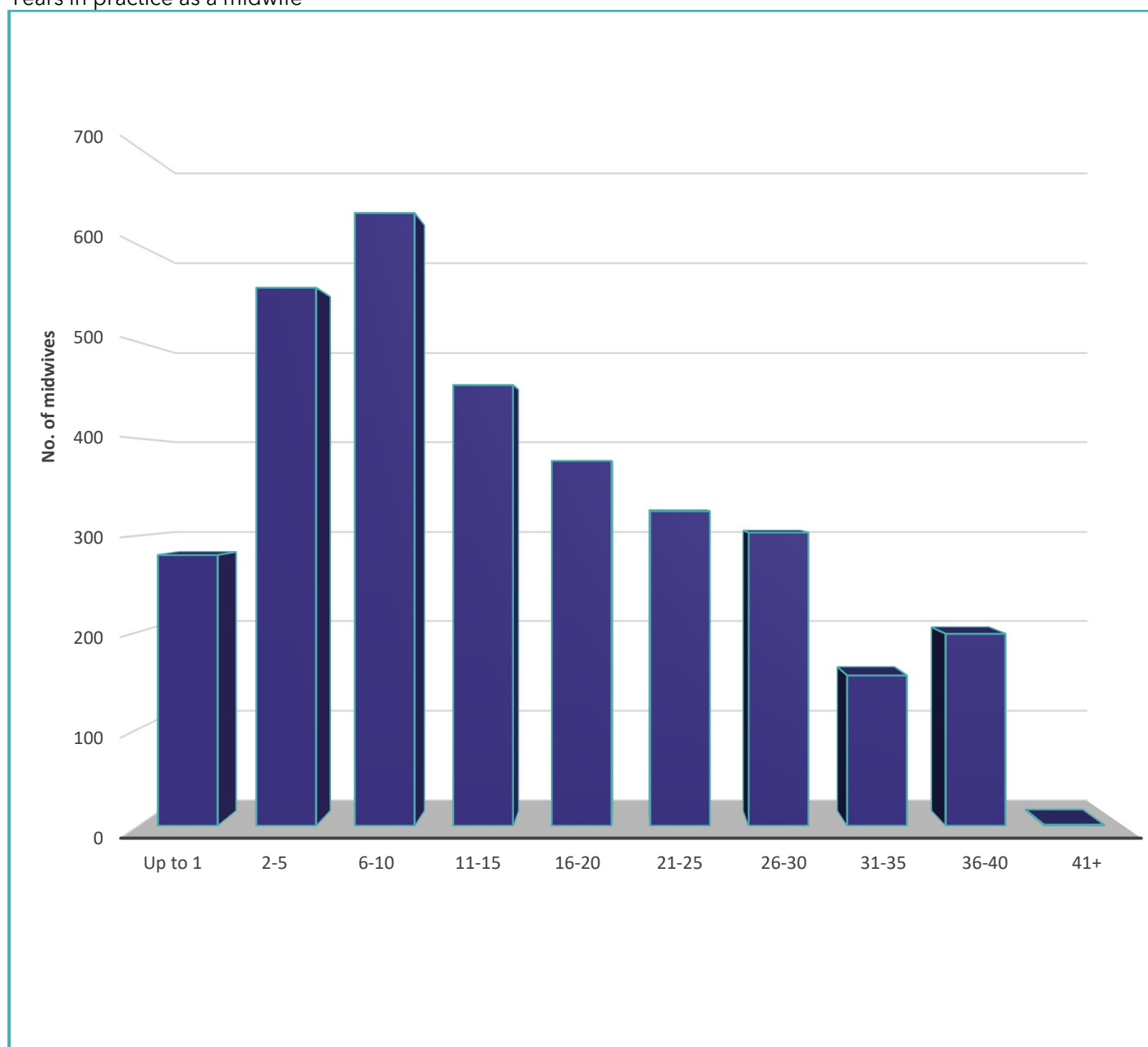

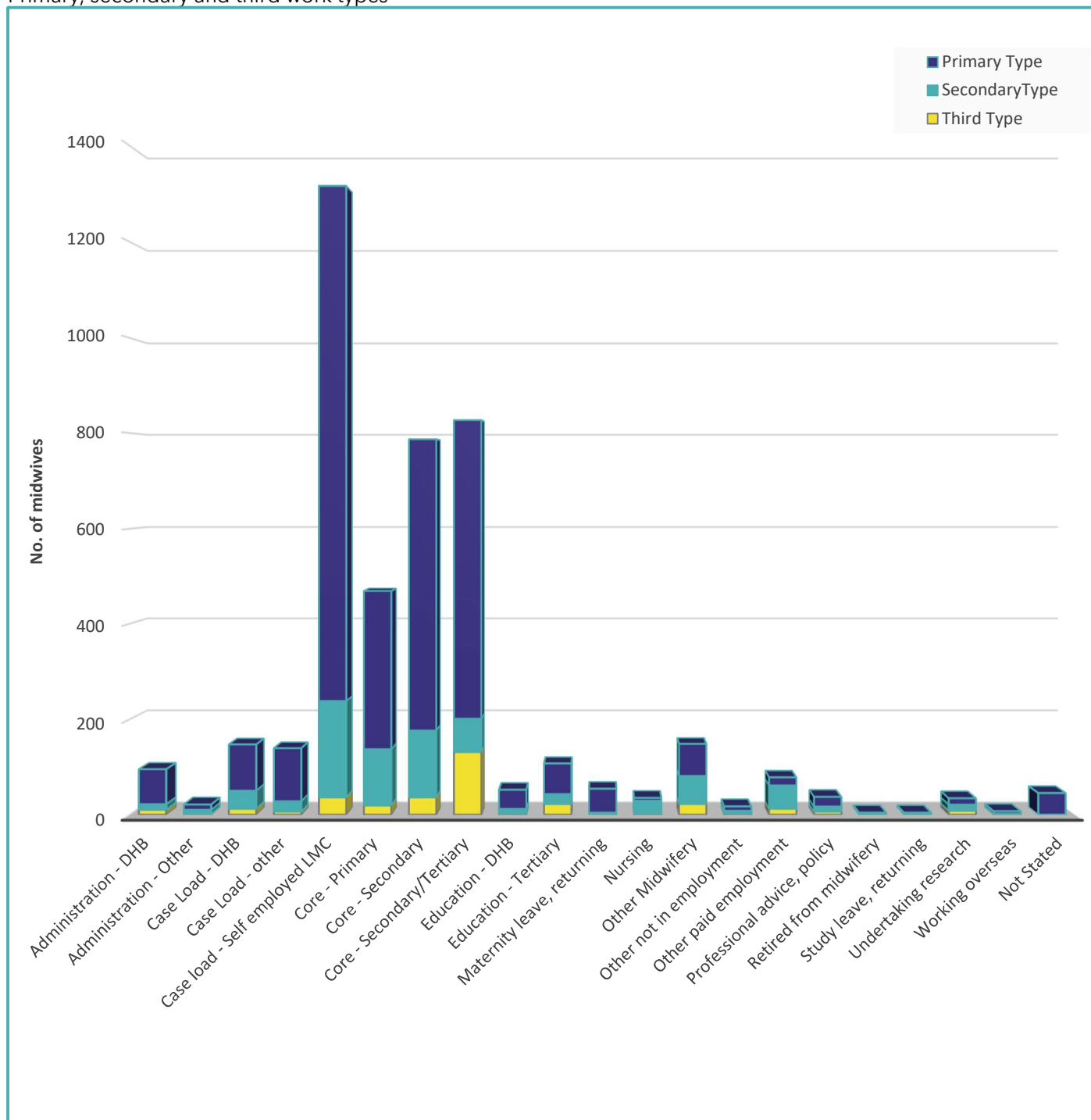

Primary, secondary and third work types

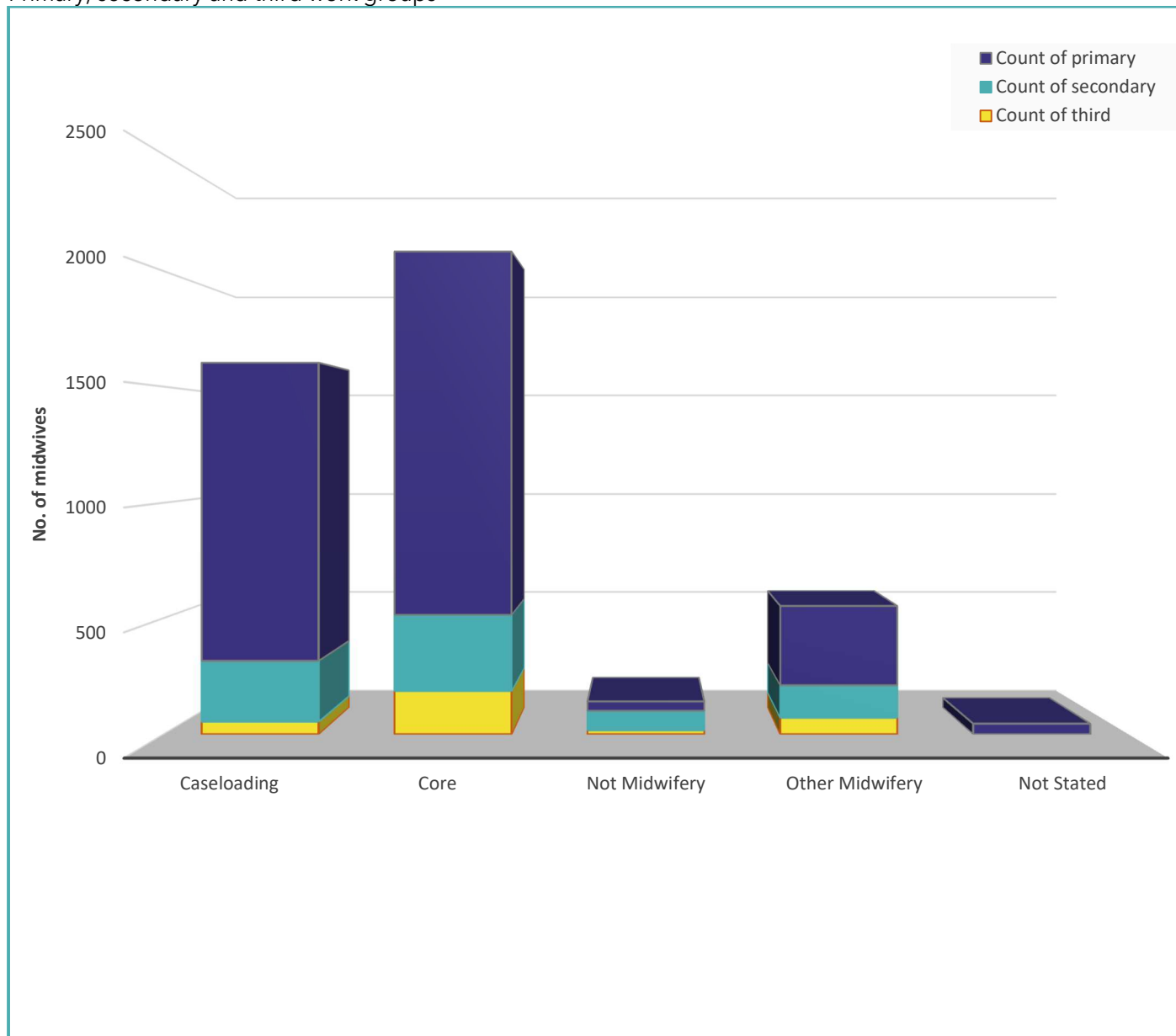

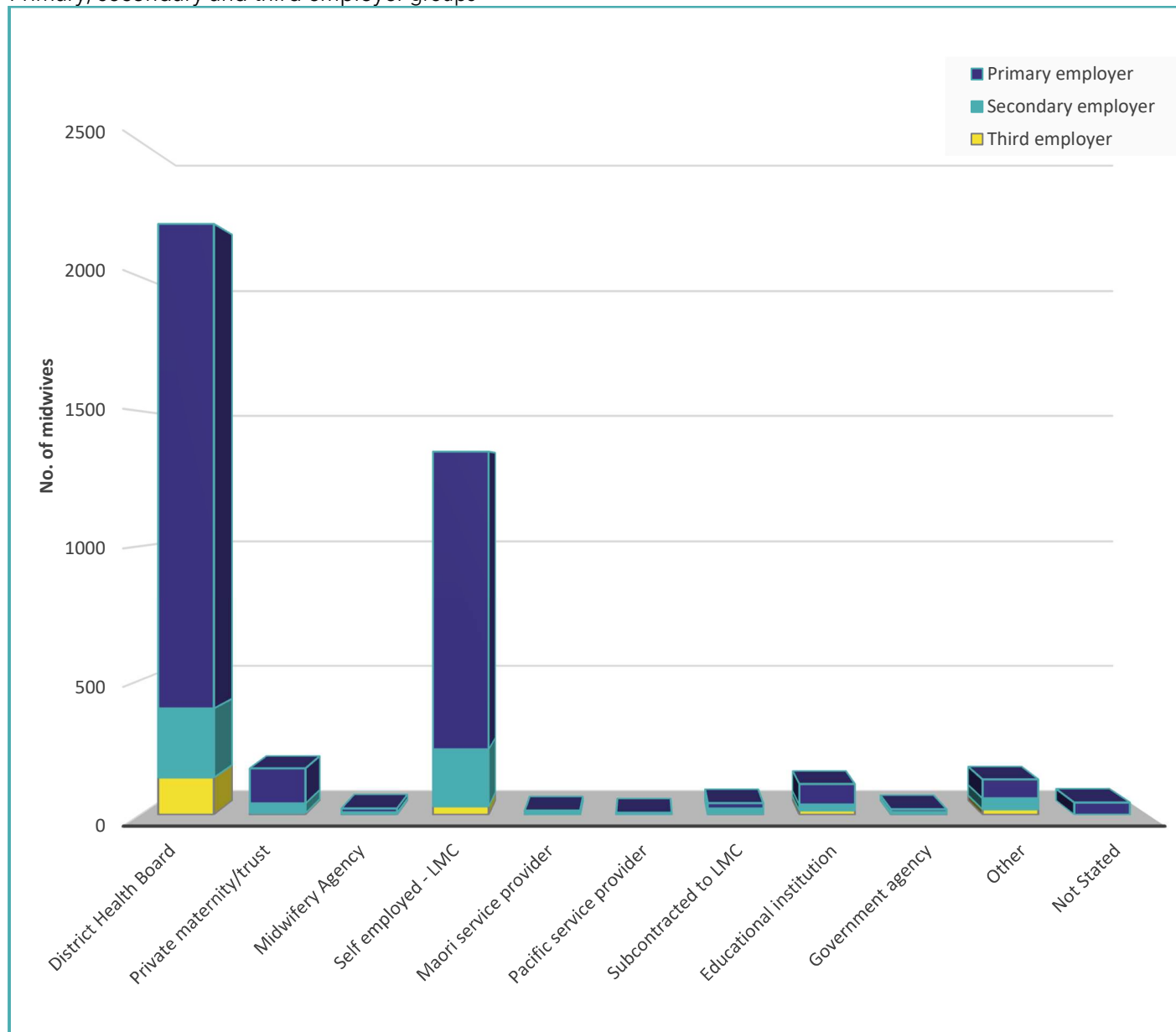

Summary of DHB area

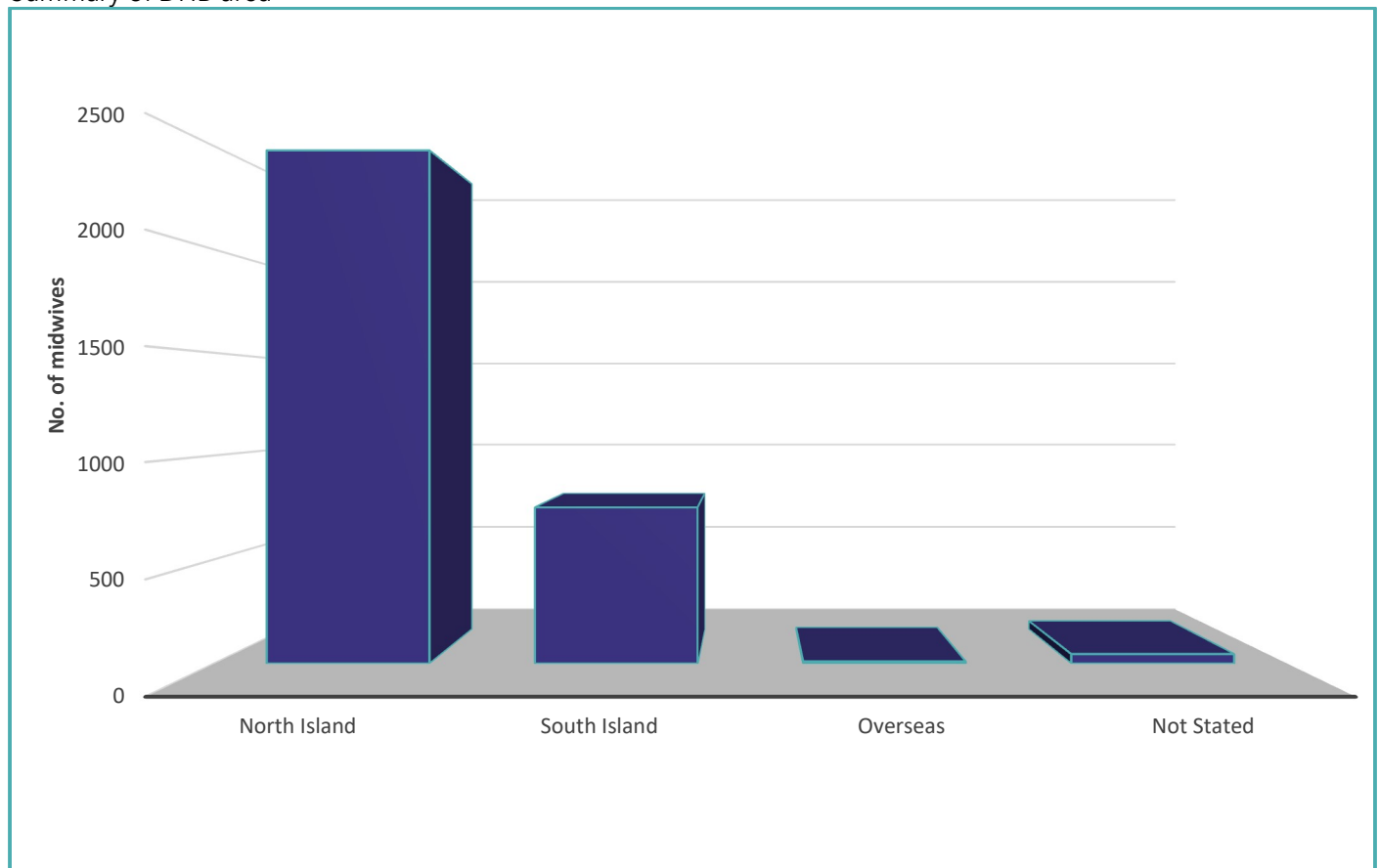
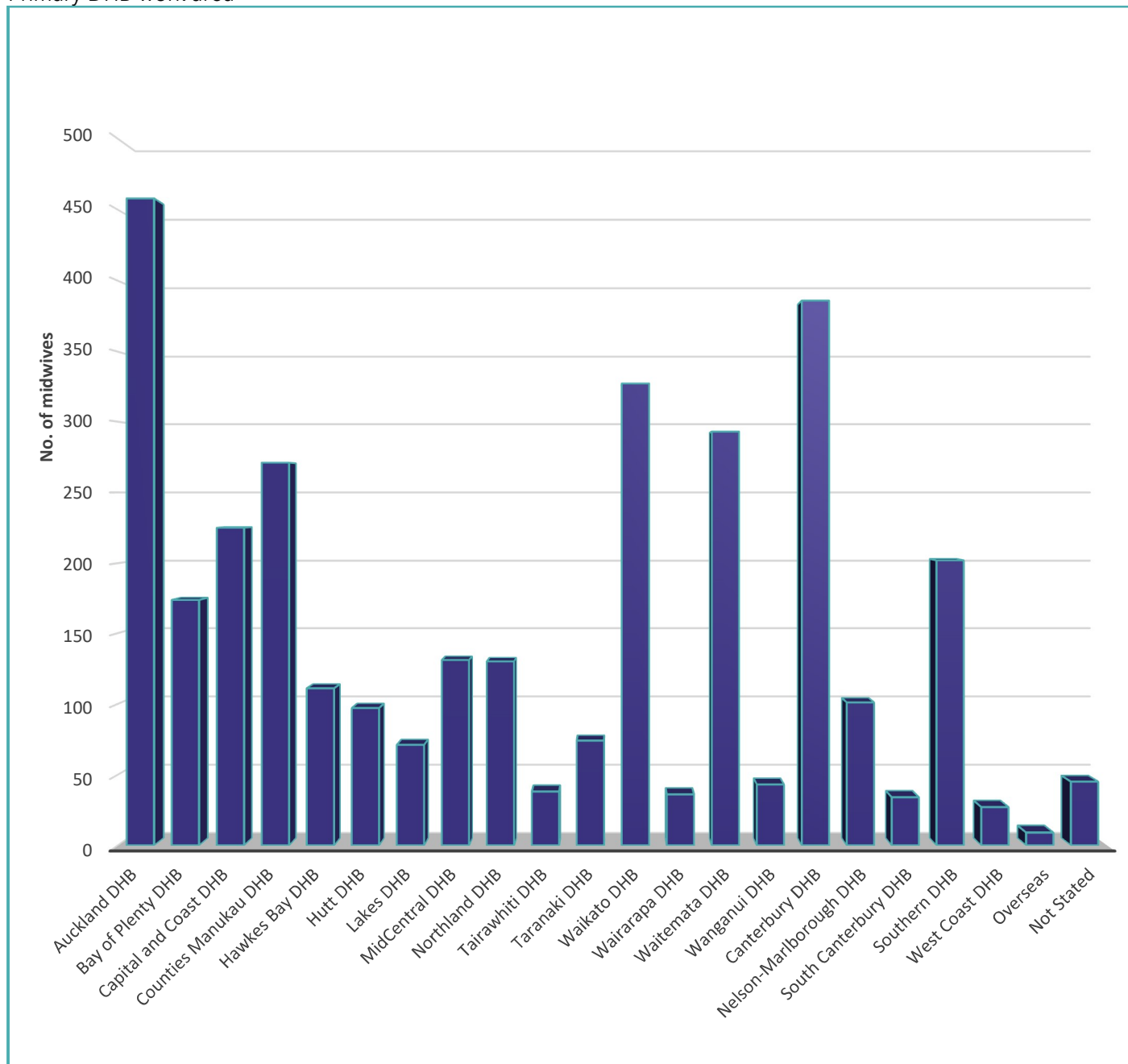

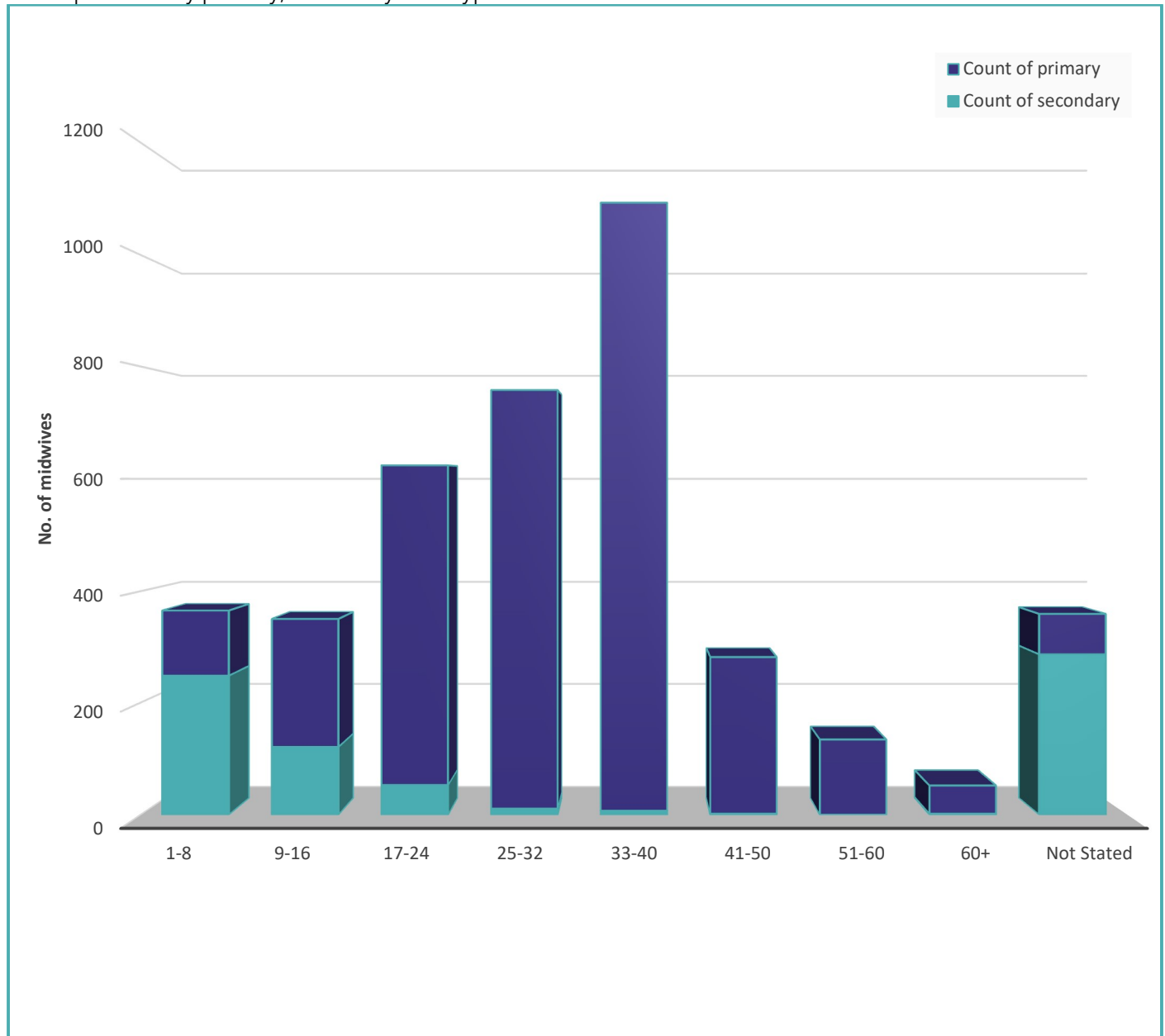

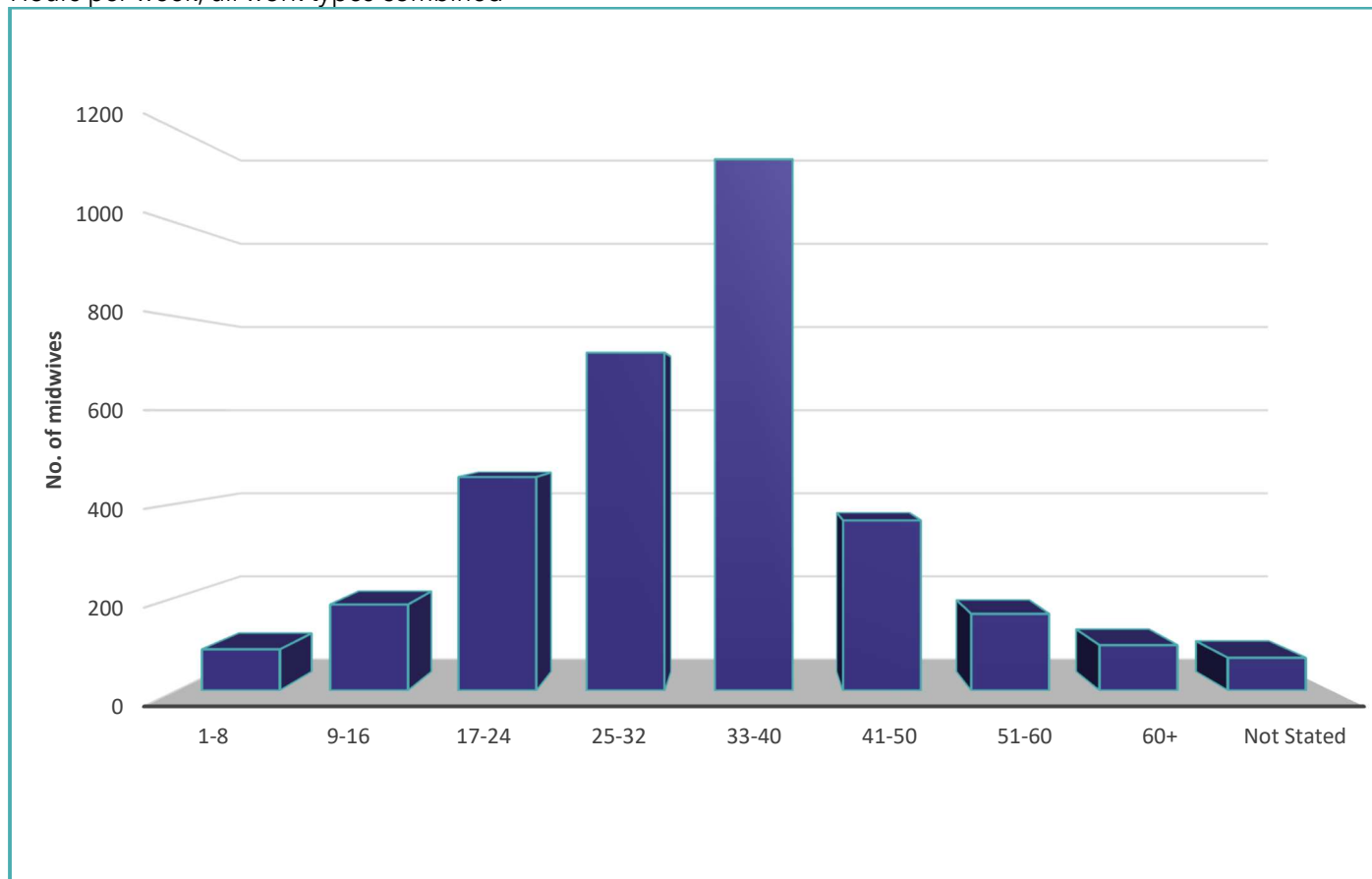

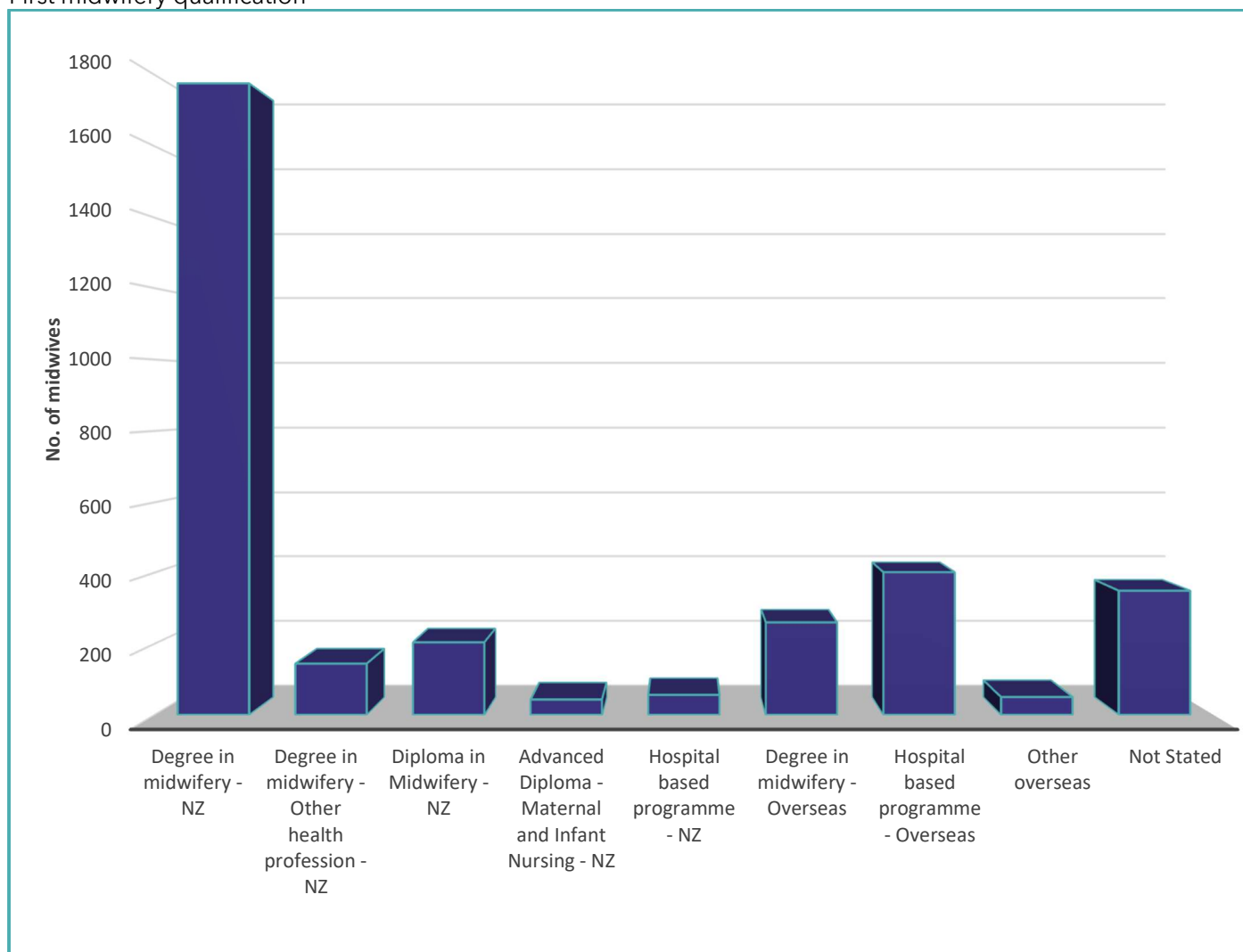

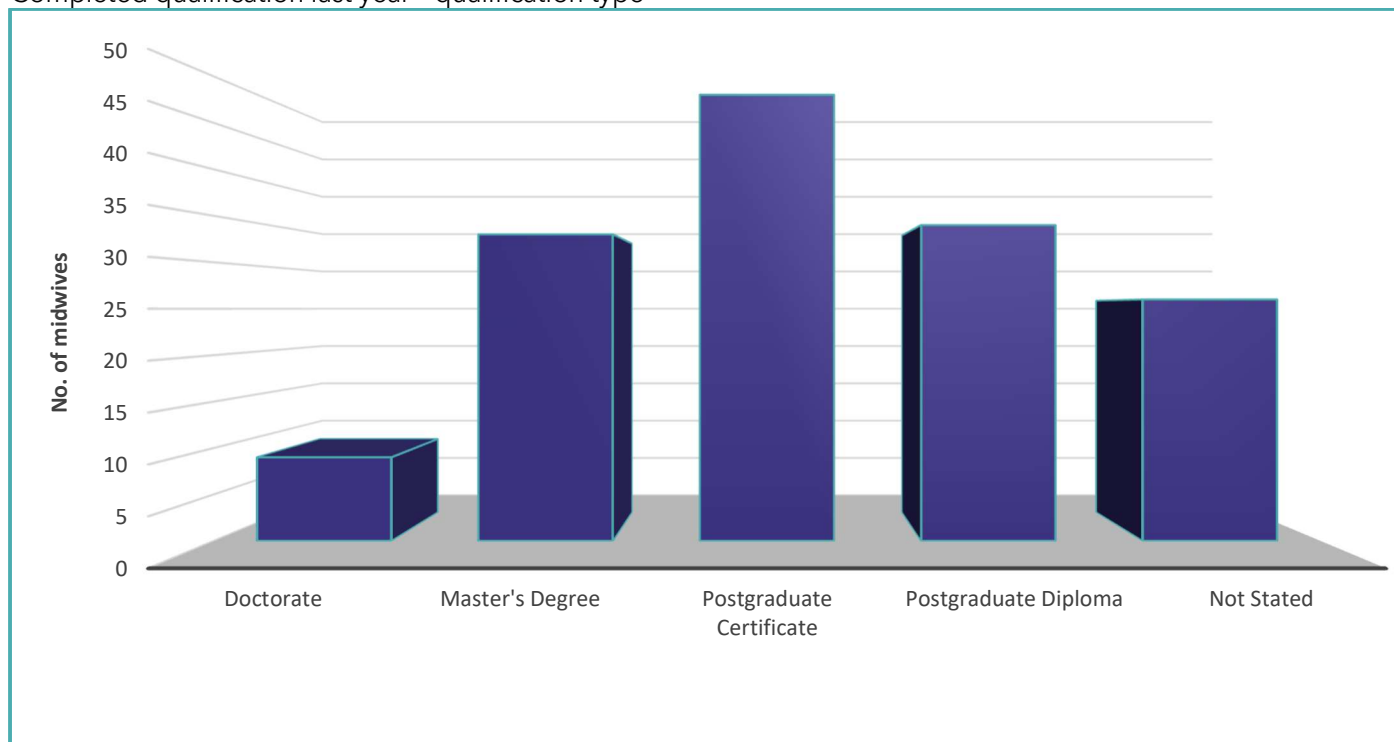
